n 2021, Yarmouth Hospital Foundation (YHF) committed a total of \$1,529,590 towards essential equipment for Yarmouth Regional Hospital (YRH), serving Yarmouth, Digby and Shelburne counties. Among these purchases were a \$76,913 surgical table for Perioperative Services (page 14), two bladder scanners for a total of \$36,000 (page 24) and \$399,950 for 41 ceiling lifts for the medical/ surgical floors (page 11), which improve conditions on the wards for patients and staff alike.

#### Also -

We announced our incredible gift of **\$22 million** (page 4) to improve health care in the area served by YRH for now and for generations to come!

We achieved *accreditation* (page 6) with Imagine Canada, one of only four hospital foundations in Atlantic Canada to do so!



Message from the chair

he role of hospital foundations has become increasingly important in Nova Scotia to ensure that our hospitals have the equipment and facilities needed to provide excellent health care and Yarmouth Hospital Foundation is committed to rising to the occasion. In 2021, our focus was on equipment for the OR that both improved outcomes for patients and also expanded the kinds of surgical procedures that could be done in our hospital so patients could avoid travel during a pandemic and beyond.

The largest share was \$10 million raised in the 1990s for the major hospital expansion that opened in 2000.

We've worked hard over the past two years, investing \$2.25 million for a variety of much needed equipment thanks to the incredible generosity of our donors. We were blown away by 2021's WE CARE Radiothon raising \$181,000 and then the Christmas Appeal brought in more than \$90,000. We are so fortunate to have such tremendous support and we're dedicated.

to both earning and keeping that trust. Last summer we were granted accreditation by Imagine Canada, the umbrella organization for Canada's charities that sets standards for accountability, governance and transparency. Yarmouth Hospital Foundation is one of just four in Atlantic Canada to have earned this distinction, which ensures we have a well-run,

efficient, and fiscally responsible organization.

The future holds many exciting opportunities to expand and improve health care in the Tri-Counties. We'll soon be faced with a request from the Department of Health and Wellness to support fundraising efforts for a hospital expansion to house a new Emergency Department. This project will transform our regional hospital and the services it delivers. The foundation will be there to do our part in making it a reality, and we know we can count on the generosity and support of the people of Yarmouth, Digby and Shelburne counties.

## Anonymous donor gifted Yarmouth Hospital Foundation with \$22 million



"It really is a game changer in terms of the opportunities that will now exist for the foundation."

Dr. Brendan Carr former CEO, Nova Scotia Health On March 10, 2021, amidst much speculation and excitement, Yarmouth Hospital Foundation announced to the people of the Tri-Counties that a mystery donor had gifted the foundation with the largest donation ever received in YHF's 50-year history: an astonishing \$22 million.

"The donor wished to improve the provision of health care in the area served by Yarmouth Regional Hospital and not to receive any public recognition. We honoured those wishes by creating the Healthcare Enhancement Endowment," Dr. Harold Cook, then-chair of Yarmouth Hospital Foundation's Board of Directors and former Dean of Dalhousie University's Faculty of Medicine, said. He added that he was unaware of any charitable gift of this size to any health care foundation in Atlantic Canada. "It is extraordinary and certainly the largest Yarmouth Hospital Foundation has ever received."

The \$22 million entrusted to the foundation has been carefully invested through our established processes under the guidance of the board and the Investment Committee. Up to 5% of the initial gift, amounting to at least \$1 million annually, will be allocated from the income generated. Of that, the foundation plans to direct approximately 85% to equipment, special projects and program enhancements at the Yarmouth Regional Hospital. Additionally, a YHF special committee will direct up to 15% to programs and services outside the hospital whose goal is to enhance the health and wellness of the region.

"We have a very generous community who have enabled us to support Yarmouth Regional Hospital in areas of greatest need, purchase capital equipment and help fund special projects," said Paulette Sweeney-Goodwin, CFRE, former managing director. "This exceptional gift will enable us to have a lasting impact on health care in this region which is what the donor wanted. These past years with the COVID-19 pandemic, we have all seen how our health is our greatest asset."

## YHF's Commitment to Healthcare Community Fund and the Healthcare Enhancement Endowment (HEE)

The transformational gift of \$22 million from an anonymous donor that Yarmouth Hospital Foundation received came with instructions to support health care initiatives across the area served by Yarmouth Regional Hospital — Digby, Shelburne and Yarmouth counties, not just within the hospital. To oversee this work, the foundation board created the Healthcare Enhancement Endowment (HEE), and adopted a policy to invest 15% of its projected annual investment earnings from the HEE (approximately \$150,000) toward community initiatives that align with the existing mission and goals of Yarmouth Hospital Foundation.

"Funding has been made possible by the overwhelming generosity of an anonymous donor, and we have been



able to build on that," explains Melanie Kenney, HEE committee chair (pictured *left*). The committee developed eligibility criteria for the Commitment to Healthcare Community Fund, along with

a process for reviewing, ranking and selecting from the many applications received from across the Tri-County area.

"Born and raised in this community, I was absolutely inspired and uplifted to learn about new and existing initiatives in our area and the community support behind them," Melanie said. "There's nothing better than when you can give back to the community and enable other people to keep giving."

## 2021's Commitment to Healthcare Community Fund Grant Recipients

Bay Side Home (Barrington): Two Hippocampe all-terrain chairs to take residents outside of the home to areas of the community, such as beaches and trails, that lack wheelchair accessibility.

Children's Aid Foundation of NS: Health & Well-Being Fund exclusively for underserved, atrisk and vulnerable children and former youth in care, ages 0-24, in the Tri-Counties.

**Digby & Area Health Services Charitable Foundation:** Infant scale and baby warmer for Digby General Hospital.

Le Transport de Clare Society: Transportation to and from hospital for medical appointments such as dialysis for lower-income residents of Digby County.

Roseway Hospital Foundation (Shelburne): Contribution to the purchase of a digital x-ray machine for Roseway Hospital.

**Villa Saint Joseph du Lac (Dayton)**: Therapeutic sensory room for long-term care residents.

**VON Tri-County:** Expansion of the Meals on Wheels program from Shelburne to Cape Sable Island.

Yarmouth and Area Chamber of Commerce: Furnishings for the Credit Union Place medical student and locum units on Vancouver Street.

Yarmouth County Ground Search and Rescue Team: Standard first aid with CPR and AED training for 35 members this year and 15 additional members each year for the next three years.

Yarmouth County Splash Park: Community initiative designed to provide opportunities for active, healthy living and to increase inclusion and access to recreation for those who face constraints to participation.

**Yarmouth County Hospice Society:** Oximeters for VON nurses who provide quality care for end-of-life patients who wish to remain at home.

In bestowing this accreditation, Imagine Canada has recognized Yarmouth Hospital Foundation's excellence and compliance in five fundamental areas of operations: board governance, financial accountability and transparency, fundraising, staff management, and volunteer involvement. The foundation is pleased to join the group of more than 250 charitable and nonprofit organizations nationwide that have earned this symbol of trust.

Just four hospital foundations are accredited in Atlantic Canada, all within Nova Scotia. Besides YHF, they are OEII Health Sciences Centre Foundation, Cape Breton Regional Hospital Foundation and Cobequid Health Centre Foundation.

"Imagine Canada's accreditation is a rigorous process that requires a deep commitment by both the volunteer board of directors and organization's staff. To complete this process during such a challenging year is commendable," said Bruce MacDonald, president and CEO of Imagine Canada.

### Fundraising: Y95/CJLS



A community radio station that believes in its community and in giving back

Without our presenting sponsor Y95.5/CJLS Radio, there would be no WE CARE Radiothon. The radio station, a subsidiary of Acadia Broadcasting Ltd., has been an enthusiastic partner with Yarmouth Hospital Foundation since the launch of the WE CARE Radiothon in 2017.

"It's amazing what happens when the community comes together," said Eric Whynot, regional manager for Acadia Broadcasting and a member of the Radiothon Committee. "To partner with the foundation on the radiothon — it's a win for the foundation, it's a win for the hospital, it's a win for the community, and it's also a win for the radio station.

"We don't do it for the accolades," Eric said. "We do it because it benefits the community — and that includes our staff — in a direct way."

Hartley Reede, Y95 Program Director and a key on-air personality during the radiothon, added that the staff love the opportunity to participate in raising money for equipment for Yarmouth Regional Hospital, talking to the medical staff, YHF officials, volunteers and donors and sharing the stories that come up on the day. "We're the trusted voice that the people of the Tri-Counties look forward to hearing on a daily basis," Hartley said. "So when we can deliver a message or an encouragement for our listeners to raise money, we're the people who go to bat for that."

Radiothon day means extra work for the staff due to the special technical requirements, and juggling schedules to fit in all of the required everyday broadcasting elements — news, weather, music, commercials, etc. — around the various interviews and updates associated with raising money for the hospital. Nonetheless, the Y95 staff are energized by the process and are always thrilled by the outcome. At the end of the day, when another successful radiothon announces a final total, a few tears of joy are shed, Eric admitted.

Y95's support is not limited to the radiothon. For years it was a sponsor of the Spring Gala, last held in 2019, and is listed in the Leader category on the foundation's Wall of Honour in the hospital lobby. Yarmouth Hospital Foundation is grateful to enjoy the wholehearted participation and support of Y95.

In the fall of 2016, Jeff Little, board member and chair of the Public Relations/Marketing Committee, and then development officer and now managing director Mary Surette proposed that Yarmouth Hospital Foundation embark on a new fundraising initiative, and the WE CARE Radiothon came into being. **That first radiothon raised nearly \$93,000** — and it was just the start.

2021 marked the 5th anniversary of the WE CARE Radiothon and, despite the challenges presented by running a major fundraiser during the COVID-19 pandemic, the day

was a ground-breaking success:

Our committee and donors rose to the challenge and raised \$181,00 for Perioperative Services!

(Of that amazing total, \$50,000 was a donation from the Tri-County Betterment Association!)

"The radiothon is special because it allows everybody to participate — sponsors, school kids, community groups, anyone with a few dollars to drop

into the change bucket," Jeff said. He also described it as a 10-hour infomercial for the role of the foundation and the many services of our regional hospital. "The hospital is

something that gives back to everyone in the community," Jeff said, "so it inspires a great sense of community generosity."



In his five years as chair of the WE CARE Radiothon Committee, Jeff is proud to report that sponsors (he's one) and donors have raised over half a million dollars towards the purchase of a wide array of vital hospital equipment!

## Tri-County Betterment Radio Bingo boosts health care funding

'he men and women of the Tri-County Betterment Association have a serious purpose I but also have a lot of fun while they're at it. For almost 19 years the Tri-County Betterment Radio Bingo has been running on Y95, Monday evenings after the 6 o'clock news. They sell \$15,000 a week in bingo cards — \$8/card — in shops from Bear River to Lockeport.

Radio bingo was the brainchild of Ken Hatfield, who brought together a team of mostly Masons and Shriners and their wives. Ken and his core group get together weekly to tally the proceeds, make jokes and tease each other. All told, the association has donated more than \$750,000 to a wide range of charitable organizations across the Tri-Counties, including food banks and school breakfast programs, Boy Scouts and Girl

Guides, fire halls and other service clubs, as well as all

three hospitals.

"They're all part of the puzzle that support each other and keeps the community together and prospering," Ken said. The assocation's tally for 2021 was \$250,000 — "that's a quarter of a million dollars," he repeated.

The Tri-County Betterment Association has been particularly generous to Yarmouth Hospital Foundation with donations totalling more than \$121,000. In 2021 alone the association donated \$50,000 to the WE CARE Radiothon. (pictured right)

Why help the foundation? Ken was clear:


"Everybody uses the hospital one time or another. We're all in this together."



## Equipment in focus: ceiling lifts







Yarmouth Regional Hospital serves the Tri-County area of Yarmouth, Shelburne and Digby counties: it is a regional hub and essential to our greater community. However, prior to 2021, it was the only regional hospital in Nova Scotia without a truly critical piece of equipment: ceiling lifts.

Yarmouth Hospital Foundation started to fundraise for the purchase of 13 ceiling lifts for the ICU unit with our 2020 Christmas Appeal after the urgent need was highlighted. The incredible utility of the lifts and the pressing need for them beyond just the ICU led to the inclusion of more ceiling lifts for additional areas of the hospital on our 2021

Board member Joy Gillespie was a strong supporter of this initiative:

equipment list.

"I was thrilled by the purchase of ceiling lifts for the inpatient units. As the former health service manager for the cardiovascular units, I saw first hand the struggle nurses had trying to move patients without this vital equipment. These lifts provide safe, comfortable

ease of transfer for patients as they are moved from bed to chair, etc. They protect the patient, they protect the care providers: it's a win/win situation!" she said.

Holly Foster, team lead for 3-CV East, one of the first wards to have its ceiling lifts installed, was as delighted by them as Joy had anticipated. "We love our new ceiling lifts and appreciate the foundation supplying them so we can provide top-notch care to our patients while avoiding injury to ourselves. Thank you so much!"

In total, \$399,950 was spent on 41 additional ceiling lifts in 2021, and that was entirely funded by foundation donors — so thank you, once again, for your generosity!

## Message from the treasurer



Who would have thought that, two years later, we would still be in a pandemic?

While the pandemic has spelled the end of the annual Spring Gala and Jody Shelley's Golf Fore Health Tournament, the foundation's supporters have continued to step up

and provide generous donations. The 2021 WE CARE Radiothon raised over \$181,000 (page 9) and the 2021 Christmas Appeal over \$90,000. Both were record setting achievements.

Aside from the regular fundraising appeals, the foundation continues to rely heavily on major gifts and bequests to support its programs: fortunately, these two categories alone contributed in excess of \$280,000 in 2021. All this allowed the foundation to purchase equipment for the hospital for a grand total of \$1.5 million in 2021. (See right for the breakdown)

The endowment from the \$22 million anonymous gift (see page 4) permitted the foundation to also accord special grants to organizations serving the Tri-Counties in areas related to improving the provision of health care. Approximately \$150,000 was provided in 2021 for 11 projects approved by a special committee of the foundation, with local representation, created for this purpose. (page 5)

Looking ahead, the foundation is embarking on a bold plan to provide more funding for equipment at Yarmouth Regional Hospital. The board has approved approximately \$3 million for 2022.

There was some trepidation that the gift of \$22 million might dampen the enthusiasm of the foundation's donors, but that has not been the case. There is a saying that "Success begets Success" and the foundation continues to benefit from the generosity and support of our donors.

## Equipment in focus: surgical services

In 2021, Yarmouth Hospital Foundation's equipment commitments included the purchase of several critical items for the Perioperative Care/Surgical Services team.

#### Five Ophthalmology Stretchers

cost \$48,000

These stretchers (pictured right) support patients before and during eye surgery procedures, mainly for cataract surgery. Cataract surgery replaces the cloudy lens caused by the cataract and therefore improves the patient's vision and quality of life.



## ACL Repair Orthopedic Instruments cost \$45,000

The ACL (anterior cruciate ligament) is one of four primary ligaments that provides stability to the knee joint. ACL reconstruction is surgery to replace a torn ACL. The surgery improves a patient's mobility. (pictured left)

## C-Mac Fibreoptic Scope cost \$25,000

This flexible scope attaches to a video intubation machine that allows visualization of the patient's airway. This piece of equipment provides increased safety to the teams — in particular during COVID — allowing distancing during placement of the intubating (tube. (pictured right)



**Did you know...** The perioperative period is the time period of a patient's surgical procedure. It includes ward admission, anesthesia, surgery, and recovery.

## Colposcope cost \$35,893

The Colposcope (left) is used for gynaecological procedures both in the perioperative setting as well as in an ambulatory care setting. This device provides amplified visualization during examination of the cervix to detect cancerous or precancerous or abnormal cells.

#### **Surgical Table**

cost \$76,913

A state-of-the-art surgical table (below right) offers angle adjustment capabilities that can help your surgeon reach the surgical area more comfortably and safely. It is also critical to delivering the right dosage of anesthesia.

"The new table offers the additional benefit of expanding the kinds of surgeries that can be performed in Yarmouth and therefore eliminating travel for many patients," said Yarmouth Regional Hospital Site Medical Lead and general surgeon Dr. Chris Murphy. (pictured below)



### Impact: Wanda Devine & Susan Reed



One Saturday night in July 2021, Wanda Devine — who has suffered from Crohn's Disease for years — was in the Emergency Department in extreme pain. Dr. Oleg Lefel diagnosed her with sepsis, a potentially life-threatening condition that occurs when the body's response to an infection damages its own tissues, and immediately whisked her into the operating room. "He literally saved my life," Wanda said. Just 36 hours later, she had to undergo a second surgery to attach a colostomy bag.

Wanda spent 16 days in recovery and has nothing but praise for the amazing care by all the staff on the surgical ward: "The doctors and nurses were so compassionate and caring," she said. One of the nurses, whom she'd known from childhood, would stay after her 12-hour shift to wash Wanda's hair and give her a back rub. The ostomy nurse who helped her during those difficult days keeps in touch and continues to provide advice and care. "It wasn't a wonderful stay, but they made my stay the best possible experience that it could have been."

When she was feeling better, Wanda made a point of sending thank-you notes to express her appreciation for the care she received — and reached out to YHF to share her story.

## Patient stories with Wanda & Susan

Spending four months in hospital is no one's idea of a good time, but Susan Reed is full of praise for the staff at Yarmouth Regional Hospital who helped her during a difficult period. "From the RNs to the guys who drove the big floor cleaners: they were kind,

professional and pleasant," Susan said.
In December 2020, she arrived at the Emergency Department in great pain, very weak and with virtually no blood circulation in her left foot. She received immediate attention and was transferred to Halifax for surgery to remove blood clots. Ten days later she was returned to Yarmouth for recovery and to await surgery to amputate gangrenous toes.

In the months that followed until her surgery in Kentville in April 2021, Susan spent time on the cardiac unit, 4South and 4East. She was there long enough to make friends she still keeps in touch with. She has now made a good recovery from the physical and emotional trauma. To show her appreciation, Susan is a WE CARE Radiothon supporter.

## Equipment in focus: bladder scanners



In a medical setting, there's more to peeing than just emptying your bladder.

You may feel you have go to the toilet for a wee very often without passing much, which could be a result of swelling creating the sensation of a full bladder where there isn't one — or you might have lots of wetting accidents. That can be a problem, too, as retained urine is a reservoir for bacteria and pathogens, which can cause urinary tract infections leading to damage of the renal structures and pain. There are many reasons why you might need to have a bladder scan, but avoiding infection is a big one, as is the monitoring of potential problems following childbirth, surgery or removal of a catheter.

Additionally: "It's important to know how much residual urine is in the bladder to indicate how you handle the patient," said Kristy Surette, Nurse Manager for Women's and Children's Services. (pictured left)

In 2021, Yarmouth Hospital Foundation purchased two of the latest portable bladder scanners for Yarmouth Regional Hospital, totalling \$36,000. One unit is shared by Women's and Children's Services and the OR, while the second serves the 3rd and 4th floors.

The upgrade from an unreliable older unit was gratefully received as a vast improvement in terms of accuracy and ease of use, Kristy said. "It's better for patient comfort, a lot less invasive and more accurate."

"We're very thankful to the foundation," she said. "It's so much better for patient care."

## Finding & keeping doctors

Many of us in the Tri-Counties know that it's not easy to find a family doctor. That's why Yarmouth Hospital Foundation financially supports the Community Navigator Program, part of the Physician Recruitment and Retention Project, an initiative in southwest Nova Scotia to attract and retain doctors in the local area. Rebecca Cassidy Rose (pictured right) was hired in September 2019, and continues in the role.

The Community Navigator is not a recruiter. Recruitment efforts are led by Nova Scotia Health and Dalhousie University's Faculty of Medicine. Her part is "to showcase our local communities and all we have to offer to medical professionals looking to set up or move their practice here," Rebecca said, "by facilitating local tours for interested doctors."

Although the foundation's traditional role is to purchase equipment, "it became clear that we should, and we must, do this for the benefit of our hospital and our community," said Dr. Harold Cook, board chair at the time the program was initiated.

Yarmouth Hospital Foundation provides \$50,000 in annual funding to the Community Navigator program.
